GIVING BLOOD IS SAFE AND SIMPLE

Most healthy people can be blood donors. In about one hour, donors complete a short medical history form; have temperature, pulse, blood pressure and hemoglobin measured; recline comfortably for 5–10 minutes while donating; and enjoy refreshments before leaving. Only disposable, single-use products are used to collect blood. *You cannot get HIV/AIDS or contract an illness from giving blood.*

Please eat a nutritious meal and drink extra fluids within the 6 hours before donating.

CONDITIONS AND TREATMENTS SOME MAY REQUIRE TEMPORARY WAITS BEFORE YOU MAY DONATE

Travel

Asthma
No wait if symptom-free at time of donation (medication controlled okay)

Blood Pressure
No wait if blood pressure is less than or equal to 180/100 (medication controlled okay)

Cancer
Basal cell & Squamous cell skin, or cervical in-situ—no wait. Most other cancers—5 years cancer free and before you donate, a form must be completed by your physician for our Medical Director to review. Call 571-434-3628 for form and details.

Dental Care
24-hour wait after routine procedures—cleanings. fillings: 72-hour wait after root

No wait when done in a professional setting (ear and/or body) with sterile single-use equipment; 1-year wait after accidental needle stick or any other non-sterile skin penetration

Pregnancy 6-week wait after vaginal delivery; 6-month wait after C-section Seizure 6-month wait after last seizure occurrence (medication controlled okay)

Surgery 2- to 12-week wait after minor procedures; 6 months after major procedures

Tattoo 1 week when done in a professional setting with sterile, single-use equipment and ink

• 5 years or more from 1980 to present: Albania, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Republic of Ireland, Italy, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Macedonia, Netherlands (Holland),

Macedonia, Netherlands (Holland), Norway, Poland, Portugal (includes Azores), Romania, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom, Serbia and Montenegro (former Federal Republic of Yugoslavia) You may not donate blood if you received a blood transfusion in France

between 1980 and the present. The United Kingdom Includes: England, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, The Isle of Man, The Channel Islands, Gibraltar, and The Falkland Islands.

or the United Kingdom anytime

You may not donate blood if you: tested positive for or have HIV/AIDS, or participated in events known to increase exposure to the HIV/AIDS virus; tested positive for viral hepatitis at any time or had viral hepatitis after your 11th birthday; have autoimmune disease, leukemia, lymphoma, melanoma, or multiple myeloma.
