Frederick Delius: the man and his music

About the composer

2012 marks the 150th anniversary of the birth of the composer Frederick Delius. Born in Bradford on 29th January 1862, he was brought up and educated as if he were destined to enter his father's wool business. However, his artistic inclinations and longing for independence saw him first farming oranges in Florida, then briefly teaching music at a finishing school in Virginia, before enrolling at the Music Conservatorium in

Leipzig. His subsequent move to Paris in 1888 brought him into time of romance, contact with the most vigorous and cosmopolitan artistic beauty in music environment of the day. There he

met his future wife, the artist Jelka Rosen, and in 1897 he moved with her to Grez-sur-Loing, near Fontainebleau, where he spent the rest of his life and

composed many of his finest works. Around 1922 his health began to deteriorate and when, a few years later, he became unable to see or to hold a pen he accepted the help of a young musician, Eric Fenby, in setting down his musical ideas. That extraordinary collaboration has entered musical legend. Delius died in 1934.

His considerable output comprised six operas, four concertos, works for solo singers and

orchestra, for soloists, chorus and orchestra (including A Mass of Life to words by Nietzsche), for chorus and orchestra, orchestral pieces, chamber music, part songs and over 60 solo songs. First recognised in Germany, Delius came to the notice of the English public mainly through the championship of Sir Thomas Beecham.
